

Hazardous Substances



Good Housekeeping Practices

- Containers properly labeled and stored
- Incompatible materials separated
- Storage areas labeled, protected from rain, and away from storm drains
- Flammable materials stored IAW Ft. Jackson Fire Dept. Regulations
- MSDSs located near HM storage areas



Poor Housekeeping Practices

- Unlabeled or mislabeled containers
- Hazardous materials stored in food or drink containers
- Hazardous materials stored near food or drink
- Containers left outside
- Open Containers
- Stockpiling



Container Management

- Package hazardous substances in appropriate containers
 - No food or drink containers
 - No damaged containers (i.e. badly rusted or dented)
 - No bulging containers (call ENV immediately!)
- Ensure containers are tightly sealed
- Ensure containers are labeled and marked IAW regulations
- Flammables stored IAW fire regulations



Inventory Management

- Use oldest materials first
- Track HM on the hazardous chemical inventory form (HCIF)
- Turn in completed HCIF to Reuse Center by 10th of the month

HW Satellite Accumulation Area (SAA) Requirements

- Containers must be labeled
- Containers must be closed except when adding or removing waste
- Waste must not exceed 55 gallons for more than 72 hours
- The Accumulation Start Date must be marked on the label after reaching 55 gallons
- SAA must have a sign
- SAA must be inspected
- SAA must be located near the point of generation



Hazardous Waste Minimization



- If you add 1 gal of gasoline to a drum containing 53 gal of antifreeze, you will have 54 gal of HW.
- If you keep the gasoline separate from the antifreeze, you will have 1 gal of gasoline and 53 gal of controlled waste.

Parts Washers & Weapons Cleaning Tanks

- Pre-clean equipment or parts
- Clean only parts/weapons
- Keep lids closed when not in use
- Do not contaminate fluid with other chemicals
- Before servicing a sample of fluid must be analyzed



UW Management - Lamps

- Used lamps must be carefully packed
- The accumulation start date, the phrase “Used Lamps”, and the quantity must be marked on the box
- Boxes must be sealed and protected from the weather and potential breakage



UW Management - Batteries

- Used batteries should be individually bagged and packed in a sealed container
- The accumulation start date and the phrase “Used Batteries” must be marked on the box
- Boxes should be protected from the weather



Spill Response Actions

(Spill Response Plan – Page 15 of HSMP)

- Secure & evacuate the area
- Call 911 (Fire Department)
- Protect yourself with the appropriate PPE
- Stop the flow
- Contain the spill
- Prevent the spill from reaching a storm drain or body of water
- A reportable spill is generally defined as anything over 5 gallons

Spill Response Violations



Common Violations

- Poor housekeeping
- Open, unlabeled, & mislabeled containers
- Improper disposal of rags and paper towels
- Stockpiling HM
- Unattended ground stains from POL spills
- Storage of incompatible materials/waste
- Improper management of UW (lamps)
- Spill Plan & MSDSs not available for review
- Inadequate training records

Hazardous Substance Management Class

- Annual requirement for personnel who store or manage HW, controlled waste, or have a high potential for HW generation or hazardous substance violations.
- 2 ½ hour class offered every quarter at Building 2563, Essayons Way
