


FORT JACKSON R2D1 GUIDE

The R2D1 (Reuse - Recycle - Disposal) Guide provides guidance on where and when you can take items to be reused, recycled, or disposed in accordance with Federal, State, and Army Regulations. The Recycling Center is open to everyone, but the other locations are for Fort Jackson personnel only.



The Recycling Center, 5671 Lee Road (behind Popeye's), 751-4208:

Open Monday - Friday 0700-1500, and Saturday 0830 - 1530. Recycling is mandatory per FJ Reg 200-9. Military organizations can earn money through the Unit Incentive Fund.

**Note: All drink containers should be emptied and the lids removed. All food containers should be rinsed or wiped off and the lids removed (steel lids are recyclable).*

Cardboard - includes corrugated cardboard, brown or white boxboard, and brown paper (ex. brown envelopes and brown paper bags). *Note: Waxed and grey cardboard should be thrown away or shredded and composted.*

Magazines and Newspapers - *Note: newspapers includes inserts and telephone books*

High-grade white paper - includes white copier, printer, or plotter paper. *Note: white index cards, white envelopes, and any other white paper that is not the same texture and weight as copier paper should be recycled with high-grade mixed paper.*

High-grade mixed paper - includes all paper not included in one of the other paper categories. *Note: Carbon paper, wrapping paper, tissue paper, construction paper, glossy paper, waxed paper (for peel-off labels), and blueprints should be thrown away.*

Glass - includes glass food and drink containers.

Steel - includes steel cans, lids, and other steel items. *Note: The Recycling Center does not accept steel clothes hangers, however, they can be taken to the Clothing Issue Point, Clothing Alterations Shop, and charitable organizations for reuse.*

Aluminum - includes aluminum cans, foil, food containers, and other aluminum items.

Scrap Metal - this includes non-government items such as file cabinets, furniture, pipes, signs, and refrigerators with Freon removed.

Plastic #1,2,3,4,5,6, & 7 - must be marked with a number inside the recycling symbol. *Note: The Recycling Center does not accept Styrofoam; however, local grocery stores accept Styrofoam egg cartons, meat trays, and other food & drink containers.*

Plastic Bags - includes clean, usable bags for reuse by Harvest Hope Food Bank. *Note: Unusable plastic #2 bags are accepted for recycling by many local stores.*

Wooden pallets - Standard sized pallets (48"x42" or 48"x40") in fair/good condition. All other pallets should be taken to the Mulch Site. *Note: Pallets with blue paint belong to Wal-Mart and should be returned to the Recycling Center for proper return. All pallets should be reused or returned to the manufacturer or distributor if possible.*

Christmas Trees -during the holiday season.

The Mulch Site, Golden Arrow Road:

Open Tuesday - Thursday 0730-1130 and 1245-1500. It is against the law to discard yard waste in trash receptacles. Mulch is available for use on Fort Jackson.

Yard waste - includes leaves, pine straw, tree limbs, tree stumps, grass clippings, etc.

Broken wooden pallets and bulky trash should be disposed in the roll-off bin.

The Reuse Center, 2558 Essayons Way, 751-5121:

Open Monday - Friday 1000-1400. The items available at the Reuse Center are FREE to anyone for use on post- look here before your organization buys and save money. If you have good usable items from the list below, bring them in for others to use.

Plastic buckets - includes 5-gallon buckets/ pails in good condition.

Office supplies - includes binders, folders, pens, and paper.

Cleaning supplies - includes glass cleaner, general cleaners, furniture polish, or floor wax.

Paint related materials - includes full and partially full containers of paint, spray paint, stain, varnish, paint thinner, and paint remover.

Building supplies - includes items such as joint compound, sealant, and wall base adhesive.

Household hazardous materials - includes items such as 2-cycle engine oil, tiki torch fuel.

Arts and craft supplies, automotive supplies, new batteries, printer cartridges, and bug or weed killers.

Defense Logistics Agency -Disposition Services Jackson, 1902 Ewell Road, 751-1849:

Open Monday - Friday 0700 - 1500 (appointment/appropriate paperwork necessary).

Government property (such as furniture, electronics, and appliances).

LC Incorporated, 2562 Essayons Way, 751-1967:

Open Monday - Friday 0800-1600. Accepts **toner cartridges**.

*LCI has a designated area for hazardous products that must be tracked in EESOH-MIS.

The Thrift Shop, 4711 Lee Road in the Mini Mall, 787-2153:

Open Tuesday and Thursdays 0900-1500 and Wednesday 0900-1700. Accepts new or gently used **clothes, furniture, toys, books, appliances, and other household items.**

Environmental Division, 2563 Essayons Way, 751-5011:

Turn-in hours are Monday - Friday 1000-1400. The items below are Universal Waste (UW) and must be managed IAW the Hazardous Substance Management Plan (HSMP) prior to taking them to the Environmental Division.

Light bulbs (lamps) -*Note: Incandescent light bulbs do not contain mercury, therefore place them in regular trash bins.*

Rechargeable batteries - Rechargeable Nickel Cadmium, Nickel Metal Hydride, Nickel Zinc, Lithium Ion, and small (≤ 11 lbs) Lead-Acid batteries.

Mercury-containing products - includes thermometers, thermostats, switches, and relays.
