MEMORANDUM FOR ALL PERSONNEL, U.S. ARMY GARRISON, FORT JACKSON

SUBJECT: USAG Fort Jackson Commander's Risk Management and Risk Acceptance Authority Policy

1. References:

- b. Department of the Army Pamphlet 385-30, Risk Management, 2 December 2014.
- c. IMCOM Regulation 385-10, Safety Program, 5 April 2013.

2. Maintaining a safe and healthful environment is critical and must be a priority for all garrison employees. Conducting risk assessments is an important component of risk management and must be completed by all directorates and staff agencies when involved in military or community events on Fort Jackson. In order to ensure full coverage of various events that occur daily, I have established the following as designated risk acceptance authorities:

- a. Extremely High Risk – Commanding General, USATC FJ
- b. High Risk – Commander, USAG, Fort Jackson
- c. Moderate Risk – USAG Directors
- d. Low Risk – Division Chiefs and Support Office Chiefs

3. Once initial risk decisions are reached and all controls measures applied, have the DA Form 2977 signed based upon the residual risk by an individual with the appropriate designated risk acceptance authority. Submit completed risk assessments to the USAG Installation Safety Office (ISO) for review.
