SUBJECT: Policy Letter -- Dining Facility Dress Code

1. The purpose of this policy memorandum is to provide guidance and establish standards of acceptable dress while utilizing the Fort Jackson installation dining facilities.
2. This policy applies to all patrons using the dining facilities on Fort Jackson.
 - a. The duty uniform, as applicable to every branch of service, or approved seasonal dress uniform is considered appropriate at all times. The physical fitness uniform (PFU) may be worn to breakfast and other daily meals so long as it is the designated duty uniform. The PFU will not be excessively dirty or soaked in sweat.
 - b. During off-duty hours, civilian clothing may be worn in the dining facilities provided the clothing is neat, clean, and in accordance with accepted standards of good taste.
 - c. The following items of civilian attire are not considered appropriate and will not be worn to the dining facility:
 - (1) Thermal underwear as an outer garment.
 - (2) Headgear of any type except for Drill Sergeants in the performance of their duty or when there is a requirement due to sanitation.
 - (3) Any type of shirt/blouse that does not cover the armpits and midriff, such as tank tops and tube tops.
 - (4) Any type of swim wear.
 - (5) Any clothing with holes of any kind.

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(6) Patches/badges on clothing that show signs, words, or symbols that promote drugs, alcohol, or promote crime in any manner.

(7) Trousers or slacks with patches attached over the rear seam area of the buttocks or over the pubic area with suggestive slogans.

(8) Shoes and shirt will be worn at all times. Open toe sandals will be worn with socks or nylons. No shower shoes will be worn.

d. The following guidelines apply to approved items of civilian clothing:

(1) All clothing will be clean and in a neat state of repair.

(2) Shirt/blouse will be buttoned, with the exception of the top two buttons if the individual desires.

(3) Shirts/T-shirts will not have any derogatory signs or language.

e. Radios, iPods, or other sound producing devices will not be allowed in the dining facility.

f. In the case where an opinion of what is or is not neat, clean, or in good taste, a determination made by the senior ranking individual is final.

3. This policy letter will remain in effect until amended or superseded by the undersigned.
